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BIBLINGO PHILOSOPHY

At Biblingo, we believe that learning ancient languages **doesn't have to be hard**. All that is required is consistent daily practice. If students use Biblingo **consistently**, they will develop literacy in their language of choice. This implementation guide is meant to help guide you on the best use of Biblingo for your child.

BIBLINGO FOR DIFFERENT AGES

Biblingo has been used by children as young as 3. Students who are not yet reading can practice **speaking and listening** in Biblingo's activities. Young readers can incorporate the **reading and writing** activities as well. If so desired, older learners (middle school and above) can consult the **grammar guides** for a deeper knowledge of the language, and advanced students can work through the **textbook**. Biblingo can be adapted for a wide range of ages and levels!

CHOOSING A PRONUNCIATION SYSTEM

Biblingo offers two different pronunciation systems for Latin:

CLASSICAL PRONUNCIATION

This pronunciation is a reconstructed form of what Latin sounded like during the time of the Roman Republic and Empire from the 1st century BC to 2nd century AD.

ECCLESIAL PRONUNCIATION

This pronunciation reflects the Latin of the 3rd - 4th century AD which is still the official pronunciation of the Roman Catholic Church today.

Whichever one you choose is up to you and you can always change it by clicking your initials bubble in the top right of the screen, going to My Settings, hitting the pencil icon, and changing the pronunciation.



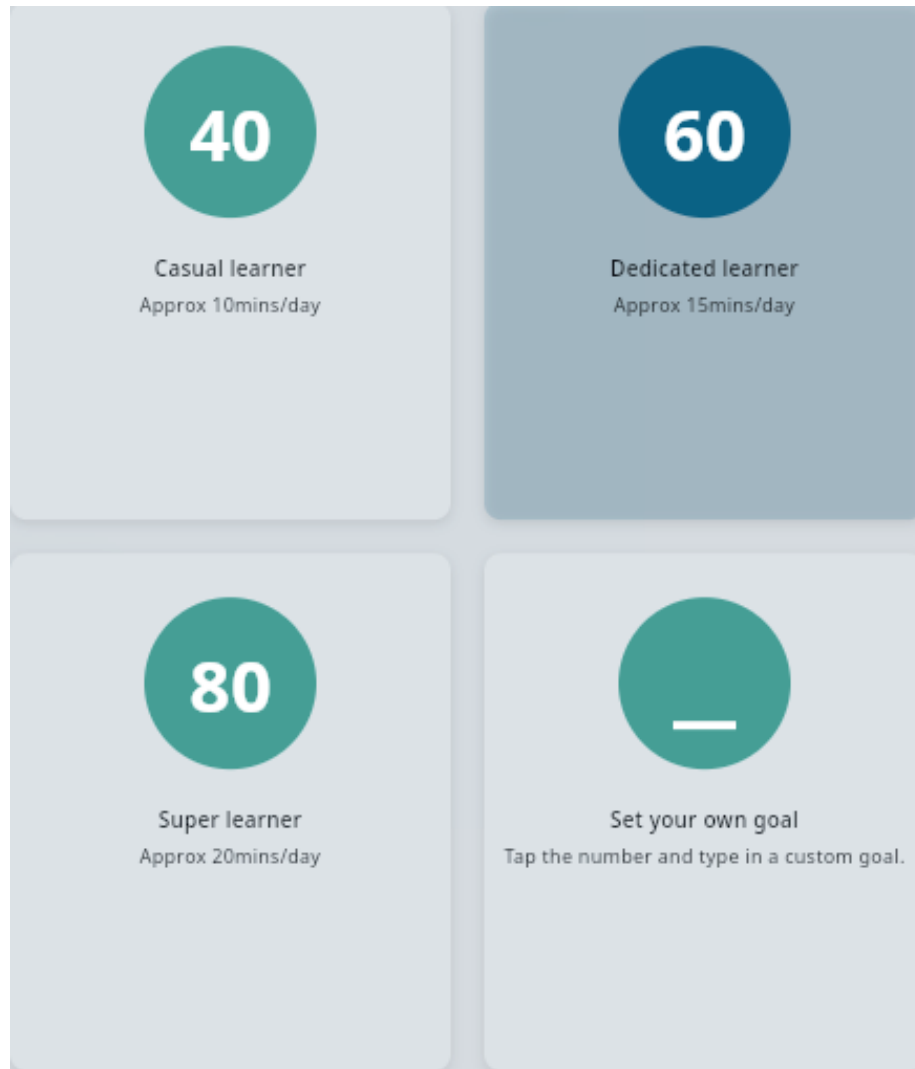

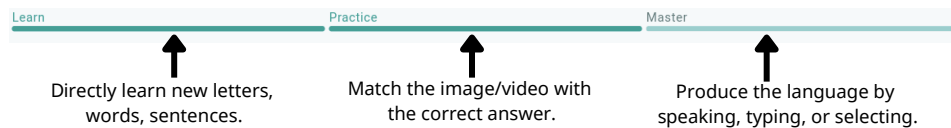

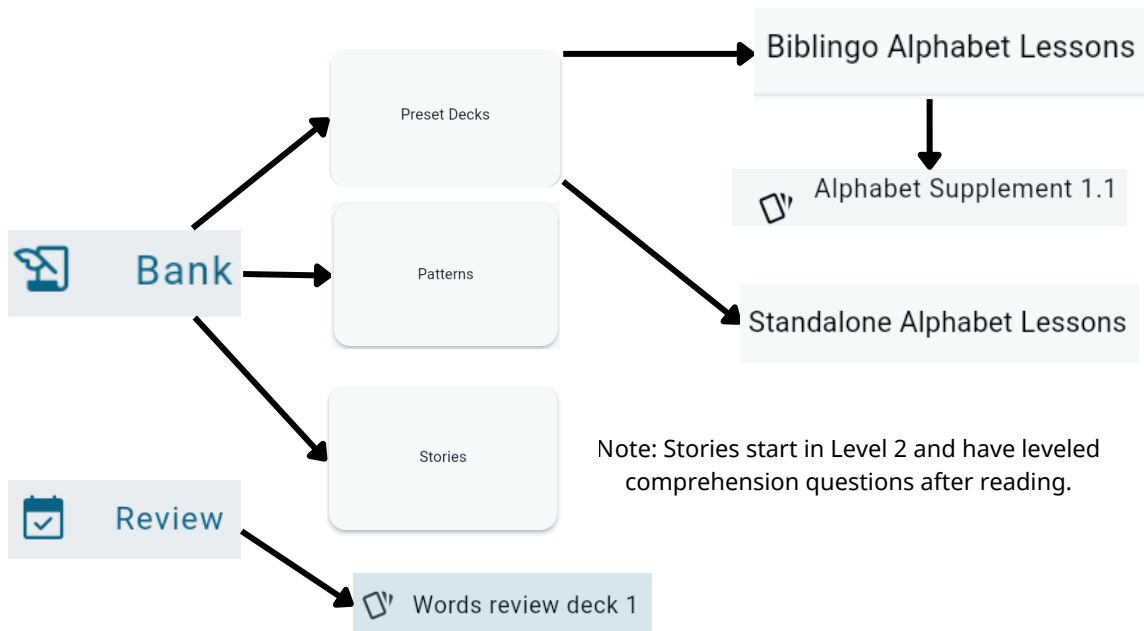
There are four lessons in each of the 52 levels of Biblingo!

MONITORING PROGRESS IN BIBLINGO

Biblingo is designed to be completely **hands-off** for parents once the child is familiar enough with how to navigate the app and how activities work. Biblingo has 3 different levels of achievement for each activity: Learn, Retain, Fluency.

LEARN, RETAIN, FLUENCY: EXPLAINED

There are three modes of learning that ensures your child masters the material:

LEARN

Your child needs to absorb new information to grow. Each time they begin a new activity, they will be doing it as a Learn activity. They will earn Learn XP for completing it.

RETAIN

Your child needs to retain the new information that they learned through practice. The goal here is accuracy. They will earn Retain XP for completing it.

FLUENCY

Your child needs to make the information that they have practiced become automatic. The goal here is speed. They will get Fluency XP for completing it.



For most Retain/Fluency activities, your child will get a percentage and time score for each activity. You can look at these to gauge your child's mastery of the content. You can use our Mastery Map from the Homeschool Resource Hub for tracking your child's progress throughout all of Biblingo on paper.

All XP your child earns will fill up their weekly goal circles for Learn, Retain, and Fluency located in the Home Tab.



WHAT YOUR CHILD DOES EACH DAY

*Your child will only need to do **two** things in Biblingo each day in order to become a fluent reader of Biblical Greek.*

1. One **Learn** activity to learn something new.
